✓ First, choose what you wish to give.

The simplest type of bequest is a general bequest, which would direct ARS to receive a specified dollar amount or percentage of your estate.

It's a simple process - a few sentences in your will or trust are all that are needed. And, it offers you flexibility. Since the gift does not transfer until after your lifetime, you can make changes at any time.

✓ Next, decide how you would like your gift to benefit ARS.

Or, we would be happy to honor your wishes to have your name(s) remain anonymous.
